As we mentioned in our last *Update*, we at the ECG are planning several ways that residents at the Esplanade can safely network. And just a note about the **annual election** on Tuesday **November 17** -- the Board of Trustees, as the Esplanade's governing body, has critical fiduciary, oversight, and strategic responsibilities and is accountable to the owners. Involvement by the owners is critical to its success. To fully participate in this important election process, our responsibility as owners is to make informed choices when deciding for whom to vote. To that end: (1) Become informed about the candidates' experience. (2) Ballots and proxies are distributed to owners by the Board of Trustees in mid-October. Owners can vote for their preferred candidates on their ballots directly or owners can vote by Proxy. If using the Proxy, give specific voting instructions to the person who exercises your Proxy so that your vote reflects your own choices. **Remember:** your vote counts!






The Splendid and the Vile: A Saga of Churchill, Family, and Defiance During the Blitz by Erik Larson

The Last Days of Night by Graham Moore


It was still light outside when the Esplanade Book Group convened on August 27 to discuss this book, loosely a historical novel and largely a legal thriller that chronicles the competition
